CEMETERY SUPPORT

St. Patrick's Cemetery Association receives no money from the church as it is a separate entity. We have set a new annual fundraising goal of \$3,000, and are asking you to prayerfully consider a much needed donation to the cemetery association to help meet our expenses. This money will be used to support the mowing and maintenance of the cemetery that is not done by volunteers. It also helps to cover the liability insurance the cemetery needs. The cemetery receives income from three sources; donations, sale of plots and interest from investments. Due to the very low interest rates, the association's interest income has become very low. The association has not been able to cover its expenses for the past five years, thus reducing the principal balance of its investments. If you have not donated before, please consider doing so next week. Donations can be made at any time. We thank you for your consideration.

St. George Cemetery depends solely upon the parish of St. Anthony-St. George for its support and its financial well-being. Money is received from donations, sale of plots and interest from investments, but those sources do not cover the annual expenses of mowing and maintenance. Therefore we will have the Cemetery Support collection next weekend to receive your donations and thank you in advance for any help you can give us.

Diocesan Pastoral Council: Bishop Coyne has decided that the Diocese should once again organize a Diocesan Pastoral Council. This council which existed in the past was discontinued years ago. The first meeting of this new council, whose purpose is to help the Bishop discern the greatest issues of concern to the Diocese, was held on May 7 in Vergennes. Membership in the council will number around 35 composed of members from each deanery, as well as special appointments by the Bishop to represent special populations such as college students. Members will be surveyed to indicate three priorities, from which three-year plans will be formulated. Thanks to Al Capone who will represent our parishes and the Franklin Deanery on the council. Future meetings will be held in September and December.
